### **8<sup>th</sup> World Summit of Young Entrepreneurs**

Around 251 young entrepreneurs from LDCs and other countries will meet to discuss innovative proposals to exploit international joint-venture opportunities in export markets and digital collaboration. Insights into such innovative collaboration will be explored through intensive and interactive exchanges involving hands-on training, on-the-spot joint venture opportunities and a virtual trade show.

At 12.00 p.m. the World Trade University (WTU), will be officially launched. This launching is one of the "deliverables" of LDC III. ### **Impact of HIV/AIDS on Sustainable Development**

HIV/AIDS has created serious setbacks to many countries' development efforts. For example, in South Africa GDP is expected to be 17 per cent lower in 2010 than it would have been without AIDS. In Botswana, HIV/AIDS will cut 20 per cent off the Government budget and reduce income for the poorest by 13 per cent. There is a need to step-up the fight against this epidemic and to greatly reduce HIV infection rates. A closely related priority is to increase budgetary allocations for basic social services, such as health care, including reproductive health care, as soon as possible.
